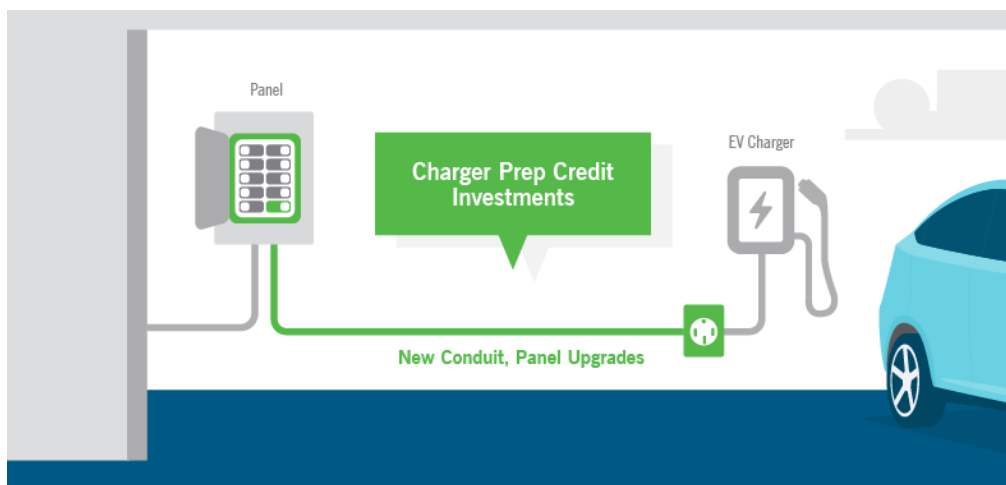


EV Charger Prep Credit Contractor Option

They will get in touch with you, provide a cost estimate, install your charger at your home and then apply the Charger Prep Credit amount of up to \$1,236 directly to your invoice for service. Covered costs include the electrical wiring and panel upgrades needed to support the charger.



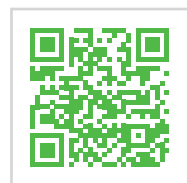
How It Works

- 1. Apply to connect with a Duke Energy-approved contractor.**
Fill out an application, upload DMV vehicle registration (registered at your Duke Energy account address) and choose a contractor.
- 2. Duke Energy will check your account to ensure it qualifies for the credit.**
- 3. The contractor will schedule a site visit.**
They will contact you to schedule a site visit, then visit and assess your electrical panel.
- 4. Purchase an EV charger** (if you haven't already).
- 5. The contractor will provide a total cost estimate** (minus credit).
- 6. Schedule contractor work and installation.**
- 7. Complete installation and pay invoice** (with credit applied).

- Fully electric or plug-in hybrid EV must be registered and installed at your Duke Energy account address to qualify.
- Make-ready work does not include the installation of the actual charger, permitting fees, upgrades to service outside the home (past the Duke Energy meter) or labor charges that support those tasks.
- Credit will be applied to your invoice from the chosen electrical contractor as a discount in the amount of the make-ready work up to \$1,236 per charger. You may apply for one rebate per EV registered to your address.

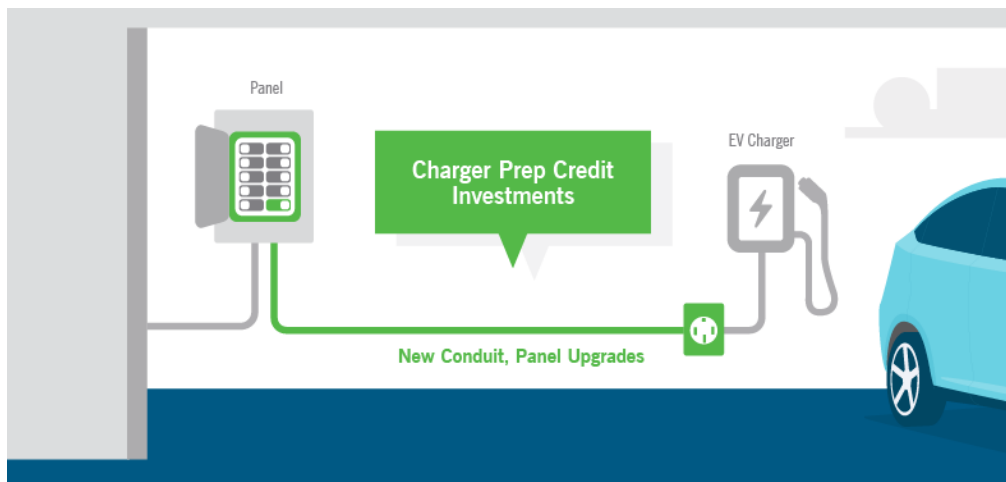

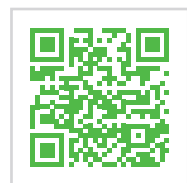
